

Relying on current evidence in the SLP literature, this seminar relies on core neuroscience and behavioral science principles to explain the impacts of the work. The underpinnings of manual therapy are introduced and reinforced through guided and assisted instruction, all in the context of a patient-directed model of care.

Therapists with no manual therapy experience will find the class supports them through learning, while those with previous experience in manual therapy, circumlaryngeal manual intervention, and other forms of manual therapy will find Walt's approach introduces further depth and meaning to existing models of care. Using a simple means of touchbased evaluation and treatment, you'll learn to include shared decision-making in guiding treatment choices. We will work our way through the diaphragm and chest wall region, into the entire anterior neck, the mouth, tongue, and face, all while applying strategies to improve conditions of dysphagia, dysphonia, globus, articulation, and many other commonly encountered problems. In addition to targeting dysfunction, we will be attending to vocal performance. Manual therapy can be a valuable adjunct to existing evaluation and movement-based treatment strategies, not necessarily intended only as a stand-alone intervention.

This seminar includes a 2-hour pre-seminar online course, which must be completed before the live 12.5 hours seminar.

After completing this seminar, the therapist will understand and apply the principles presented in evaluating and treating a multitude of voice, swallowing, and many related disorders. ASHA CEUs and NCBTMB/Massage Therapist CEs are approved, with many PT and OT State Board CEUs approvals in place.
